Diving Deeper

Knowing God's Faithfulness - Laughing at God

God does not want us to trust in methods. He wants us to trust in Him. Trusting methods rather than in a Person seriously limits how we experience God.

In times past, God spoke in dreams and visions. Using nature, prophets, a still small voice, fire... in the middle of the night, at mealtimes, at funerals, etc. The important thing was not how God spoke but that He spoke. Do not limit yourself to a method, expecting only to hear from Him in predictable ways. Rather, open yourself up to other means to which God wants to commune with you.

In current times God primarily speaks to us in these five ways:

The Church

How has God spoken through the Church? Perhaps through music, a sermon, or a testimony that really hit home and you felt that God spoke to you through it.

The Holy Spirit

For those of you that remember the rabbit ears and TV antennas – do you remember that we had to point the antenna in the right direction to get good reception.

Are you pointing your attention in the right direction to get good reception of what the Holy Spirit is telling you? This can be a small still voice.

The Word

Can you imagine driving down highway 12 at night with no lights? Since the word is a "lamp and light", wouldn't it be wise to listen to the word to find direction and safe travels through this dark world?

You may be reading your bible and a verse seems to jump out at you. You think about this scripture throughout the day. This may be God speaking to you through the word.

Through Circumstances

God can speak through the every day circumstances of life. As we journey through life some circumstances seem to be less than desirable - often painful. Be aware that God can use those unpleasant circumstances to speak to us.

For example; you may lose your job. However, through this bad experience, God opens the door to move you into another workplace that God can use you. Remember that not everything "bad" that happens to you is necessarily bad.

Through Others

God may use friends, casual acquaintances, family or a complete stranger on a plane to speak to us. Never discount what others in your life may be saying – it could very well be God speaking.

Nothing happens by coincidence. It is not a stroke of luck. Be mindful, attentive and observant that God may be speaking.

"My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand." – John 10:27-28

Sheep knew the voice of their shepherd and did not follow any other voice or shepherd. Likewise, we must learn the voice of God and follow.
